

Scrap Fabric Kitchen Towel Toppers By Leslie Sausage

Simple to make and quicker than crochet!

Supplies:

One kitchen towel, approximately 24" long by 15" wide.

Two pieces of scrap fabric to compliment your kitchen towel, each approximately 4" by 8".

One button, a snap or a Velcro closure.

Optional, scraps of lace and ribbon.

Your iron for a template.

Directions:

Put the two pieces of fabric, right sides together.

Trace the shape of your iron onto the 2 pieces of scrap fabric.

Add an additional 1" border all the way around.

Sew 1/4" seam, right sides together, leaving the back or the iron edge open.

Turn right sides out and press.

Turn under the (back of the iron) edge to the inside 1/2" and press.

Cut tea towel to desired length or use the complete towel.

Gather the cut edge or one end of the towel; tuck it into towel opening 1/2".

Sew across the folded fabric edge.

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Decorate by attaching lace trim and matching ribbon along the edge of the lace.

Finish with the button and buttonhole, a snap or a Velcro closure so that the towel can be hung on the refrigerator or oven door.

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
